# Chapter 3: Understanding Temp Work

## What Is Temporary Staffing?

Temporary staffing agencies connect job seekers with short-term or contract employment opportunities. These positions may last a few days, weeks, or months, and sometimes lead to permanent roles. Agencies act as the bridge between employers needing workers and individuals seeking immediate income or flexible schedules.

## Common Industries in Metro Atlanta

Temp agencies in Cobb, DeKalb, Gwinnett, Fulton, and Clayton counties often specialize in:

-  Industrial & Warehouse – logistics, manufacturing, distribution centers
-  Clerical & Administrative – office support, customer service, data entry
-  Healthcare – nursing assistants, medical office staff, caregivers
-  Technology & IT – help desk, software support, digital projects
-  Skilled Trades – construction, maintenance, specialized labor

## Benefits of Temp Work

- Immediate income – faster placement compared to traditional hiring

## Challenges to Be Aware Of

- Use temp work strategically: treat it as a stepping stone toward stability and long-term employment

# Chapter 4: Know Your Rights

## Why Rights Matter

Temporary work can be a stepping stone to stability, but it also comes with risks. Knowing your rights ensures you are treated fairly, paid properly, and protected from exploitation. Every worker—whether permanent, part-time, or temporary—has rights under Georgia and federal law.

### 1. Wages & Overtime

- Minimum Wage: Georgia's minimum wage is \$7.25/hour (federal standard applies).
- Overtime: If you work more than 40 hours in a week, you are entitled to time-and-a-half pay.
- Pay Transparency: Agencies must disclose your hourly rate before you accept an assignment.

### 2. Workplace Protections

- Anti-Discrimination: You cannot be denied work based on race, gender, religion, disability, or age.
- Harassment: You have the right to a workplace free from harassment. Report issues to both the agency and employer.
- Safety: Employers must provide safe working conditions. OSHA protections apply to temp workers too.

### 3. Contracts & Agreements

- Read Before Signing: Some agencies include clauses restricting direct hire by employers. Understand these terms.
- Keep Copies: Always keep a copy of your contract, pay stubs, and agency communications.
- No Hidden Fees: Agencies cannot charge you for placement. If fees appear, ask questions.

### 4. Reentry & Probation Considerations

- Equal Opportunity: Many agencies are reentry-friendly. They cannot legally discriminate solely based on criminal history unless directly relevant to the job.
- Probation Compliance: Temp work can help meet probation requirements for employment. Keep documentation for your probation officer.

## 5. What To Do If Rights Are Violated

- Document Everything: Keep records of hours, pay, and incidents.
- Report Issues: Contact the Georgia Department of Labor or Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC).
- Seek Support: Community partners, advocacy groups, and Greater Georgia Project can help navigate disputes.

Your labor has value. Temp work is not “less than” permanent work—it is a vital contribution to Georgia’s economy. By knowing your rights, you protect yourself, strengthen your community, and ensure that opportunity leads to justice.
